RULES.

1. Any Boat contesting without its proper Racing Colours shall be disqualified.
2. The Races specified in this Programme are subject to any Conditions and Alterations that the Regatta Committee may deem fit to make, and shall be contested strictly in accordance with whatever Rules the Committee lay down.
3. In any Event, three must start or there shall be no Race, and unless there are at least four starters, no third prize shall be given.
4. Should any dispute arise, the details of the same must be specified **in writing, and lodged immediately after the Race with the Committee, whose decision in the matter shall be final.**
5. All Boats competing must be entered under their real names.
6. Any Boat throwing ballast overboard while competing shall be disqualified.
7. In Events 3, 8 and 9, all competing boats on the outward journey must leave all Beacons along the Bank, small black buoy in the Cut, and red buoy North of Pool Beacon on the port hand, and all Beacons in the Cut on the starboard hand: and vice versa on the return journey. The staff buoy North-West of Life-Boat House to be the turning buoy as usual.

The turning buoy in Event 4 will be the red buoy North of Pool Beacon. All other Conditions same as above.

All boats in Sailing Events must stay round turning buoys, gybing is not permitted.
8. Racing Colours, to be applied for at the Committee Tent, must be carried at the peak or mast-head in all Sailing Races, and be plainly displayed at the stem in each Rowing Race.
9. Competitors in Swimming Races must wear caps, which can be obtained at the Committee Tent.
